NORTHEAST STUDENT DATA CORPS CHAPTER CHARTER

PREAMBLE

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Preamble

<u>The Northeast Big Data Innovation Hub</u> is a collaboration network designed to fuel data science innovation through diverse and inclusive community partnerships. We support representative community engagement and increase data science capacity and talent, with a special focus on underserved communities. <u>The Northeast Student Data Corps</u> (NSDC) is the Hub's community-developed initiative that provides a community of support, as well as resources and opportunities for learners of all backgrounds to get started or advance in data science.

Mission Statement/ Objective of NSDC Chapters:

The Northeast Student Data Corps is pleased to announce a new chapter system for student-led data science organizations. Each chapter plans to extend the mission of the NSDC by creating a community of support for chapter members and extending it through local community-development initiatives. These initiatives aim to educate underserved and underrepresented learners in data science fundamentals and provide them with mentorship, research, and career opportunities in data science.

NSDC Chapter Main Objectives:

The Northeast Student Data Corps (NSDC) Chapters will have the following main objectives:

1. **Education**: NSDC Chapters will be sources of connection for learners of all skills and backgrounds from under-resourced schools and communities, providing them with the tools and resources necessary to learn the fundamentals of data science. Chapters shall utilize the NSDC's curated educational resources from our <u>Learner Central</u> and <u>Educator</u> Central pages, and harness data science class materials from their own institution. Related

activities and events include workshops, sample use cases, and capstone projects using data science tools and techniques learned through the NSDC.

- 2. Community Development: NSDC Chapters will play an essential role in convening community members, so learners can collaborate with other data science students and members of the chapter to build a community of growth and support. Chapters shall share and distribute resources from the NSDC and the Northeast Big Data Innovation Hub to connect with colleges, universities, and local community organizations that lack data science resources and related opportunities. For example, chapters can create mentorships and cultivate partnerships amongst different institutions.
- 3. **Project-Based Collaboration**: NSDC Chapters will provide learners with the opportunity to get hands-on experience applying their data science skills to research and real world examples. Chapters shall identify and curate datasets and use cases that are relevant and valuable to members of their local chapter. Members can seek out already-curated open datasets from our <u>Educator Central</u> page, or discover local datasets that can be leveraged for data science projects. Local collaborations and research projects related to students' areas of interest can also be leveraged to fulfill this focus area.
- 4. Internships/ Career Opportunities: NSDC Chapters may provide students with preprofessional advisory services for them to learn more about applied data science fields and to embark on a career of data science through internships and job opportunities. Chapters can connect with their institution's career services team and leverage the NSDC's new Career Central and Outreach team to identify local internship and job opportunities and discover career preparatory resources, like resume and interview tools. Suggested chapter-run initiatives may include resume workshops, data science career panels, student-to-industry mentorships, and networking events with local companies and non-profit organizations.

Membership, Meetings, & Other Logistics:

Each chapter must have one or more student leaders, beginning with a Chair and secretary, who should plan to spend 5-10 hours a month to develop and lead their chapter, and an advisor who is a faculty or staff member at the university or institution. The chapter should also be approved by the students' university or institution with a record of approval emailed to nsdc@nebigdatahub.org.

As the NSDC Chapters are student-run, advisors will be working with and supporting student leaders on the various initiatives of their chapter, but not leading the overall organization. Advisor roles in relation to the student leaders can and will vary by chapter.

Chapter Leaders and Responsibilities

Each NSDC Chapter should have a Chair and secretary at minimum to run and operate their organization. Co-chairs, Vice Chairs and a treasurer may be added as required.

The Chair is the leader of the NSDC Chapter, who will lead the development of the Chapter Charter, run meetings, work with Chapter members to agree on the activities and goals of the Chapters, serve as their Chapter's delegate at regular NSDC Chapter system conferences, and be the liaison to their local institution and the Northeast Student Data Corps Central team. The NSDC Central team will host quarterly meetings with the Chair to discuss updates and information related to their Chapter.

Secretary will schedule Chapter meetings, take notes, and keep track of their Chapter's project activities plan. They will assist the Chair in Chapter operations as required, and be the communications leader, such as send out newsletters, maintain their Chapter's website, and provide outreach to attract additional Chapter members. The secretary will also oversee communication between other Chapters and the NSDC Central team.

Co-chair and Vice Chairs can be added as NSDC Chapter leaders. They can share responsibilities with the Chair as each Chapter seems fit.

If your NSDC Chapter has a local budget, a treasurer can be added to the leadership team to manage the funding of your Chapter.

Chapter Meetings:

To start off, chapters should aim to meet monthly or bimonthly. Since students have academic and other commitments to attend to, and as the NSDC Chapters develop and expand, each organization will be able to regulate their own scheduling and agendas.
